




Assembly Bill No. 1755 CHAPTER 506 An act to add Part 4.9 (commencing with Section 12400) to Division 6 of the Water Code, relating to water data. [Approved by Governor September 23, 2016. Filed with Secretary of State September 23, 2016.] LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST AB 1755, Dodd. The Open and Transparent Water Data Act. Existing law imposes on the Department of Water Resources various duties with respect to water in the state. Under existing law, the State Water Resources Control Board administers a water rights program pursuant to

which the state board grants permits and licenses to appropriate water.


USERS BY LOCATION







 - Organizations working together to build foundational water data infrastructure across the United States








Communication and Engagement

On-going Activities

Data Publication and Sharing

- Continue to add datasets from multiple sources
- Review datasets for enhancing discoverability, accessibility, interoperability, and (re)usability

Protocols and Guidance

- Define open data framework for State-held data
- Expand and enhance existing protocols and standards, as needed
- Gather feedback and revise guidance documents, as needed

 - Groundwater elevation data submittal streamlining
 - LiDAR Data




Data Publication and Sharing
